HUMA BHABHA

A Fly Appeared, and Disappeared

A Fly Appeared, and Disappeared is Huma Bhabha's first monographic exhibition in a French institution.

The artist was born in 1962 in Karachi, Pakistan, and studied in the United States, first at the Rhode Island School of Design, then at Columbia University. Now based in Poughkeepsie, NewYork, Huma Bhabha brings together different eras, materials, and iconic forms to create works that bring forth anthropomorphic and hybrid presences by constantly adding, layering, and cutting materials. The figure is ubiquitous in her work, always suggesting an ambiguous otherness, whether distant or near, ancient or unborn. This exceptional artist draws on an infinite repertoire of references, borrowing from both the academic world and popular culture, from ancient statuary to science fiction films, insisting on a universalism of forms.

Some fifty works will be displayed at MO.CO.: cork and polystyrene sculptures, bronzes, drawings on paper and photographs, photogravures and ceramics form a welcoming horde, guiding us through the artist's own syncretism. The exhibition opens with the pivotal sculpture *Centaur* (2000), then moves on to large-scale sculptures, assemblages, collages, and layering of different materials such as wire, clay, and cork. Often hieratic and dense, they recall totem poles or archaic statues, enhanced by paint or coloured polystyrene.

The anatomical details are human, often mixed with animal features (monkey, owl, dog, or wolf). In the drawings on photographs that she has taken, humans and animals appear in devastated landscapes. The use of pastel in her drawings gives a softer aspect to potential metamorphoses

or hybridisation. The links and traces are always there, within a wide range of presence and affirmation. The exhibition ends with her latest terracotta works, produced for an exhibition at Casa Wabi, Mexico, in 2022.

The exhibition highlights motifs inherent to Huma Bhabha's work, such as achronicity, layering and assemblage, fragmentation, hybridisation, otherness, the group forming a pack. Shown in France for the first time, this unprecedented selection of works will astonish and amaze, but also highlight the complexity of an ever-changing world, which the artist invokes without compromise, managing to always transcend it. The exhibition is accompanied by a richly illustrated catalogue, published in both French and English by Snoeck Edition. The graphic design was entrusted to Atelier Tout va bien. It includes unpublished texts by Numa Hambursin and Eva Barois De Caevel, as well as an interview between Huma Bhabha and Vincent Honoré.

MO.CO. has collaborated with the Belgian museum, M Leuven, currently presenting a common selection of 35 works for their summer monographic exhibition, *Livin'Things*. This partnership enables the exhibition to travel and meet different audiences across Europe. It is made possible thanks to the commitment of the artist, as well as the support of the galleries Xavier Hufkens, David Kordansky, and David Zwirner.

Under the artistic direction of Numa Hambursin, MO.CO. C.E.O, the exhibition is curated by Vincent Honoré, Director of Exhibitions, along with Rahmouna Boutayeb and Pauline Faure, curators, assisted by Alexis Loisel–Montambaux.
