This summer, MO.CO.
Montpellier Contemporain
presents solo exhibitions
by two major figures of the
French contemporary art
scene: Françoise Pétrovitch
at MO.CO. and Jean-Marie
Appriou at MO.CO. Panacée.
In parallel, the 2025 graduate
exhibition from MO.CO. Esba
(curator Sophie Lapalu) will
be held at the remarkable
heritage site of the Faculty of
Medicine in Montpellier.

Jean-Marie Appriou is an alchemist in its medieval description: he gives shape to the shapeless and explores materiality by questioning Man's connection to cosmos. He etches human figures, plants and animals on paper, carves and models clay, melts aluminum and bronze to delight the world, whispers to his blown glass, merges volcano rocks together.

His mythical universe explores the microscopic and the infinitely large. His artworks are poetic fictions, full of hybrid creatures, "exonautes", painting and literature characters as well as invasive plants. The gaze goes from the primordial soup to the stars. The exhibition is conceived like a journey crossing different worlds and combining the elements through their materiality.

La cinquième essence allows the artist to explore his medium of choice, sculpture – aluminum, bronze, glass, clay - and uses MO.CO. Panacée architecture, built around a patio, to distill the four elements employed in

his work: water, earth, air and fire. Alchemy introduces a fifth element, or a fifth essence: ether. According to its antique and medieval definition, ether is the invisible element that fills the void. It is everything and nothing, it gives life to others. That's how Jean-Marie Appriou approaches sculpture: "it is a matter of balance, of emptiness and fullness, of mass, like another part of life".

The journey starts with water, the cradle of life. Man is the child of the ocean, particularly Jean-Marie Appriou, born in Brittany in 1986. For him, "sculpting is like watching the sea recede from the shore. The final sculpture reveals itself as fragments are removed". The wind pushes the water, a wave is rolling (Ressac, 2025). The rising and ebbing tide carves the relief of The cave of time (2018) in which hands are emerging and suggesting an incantatory gesture. The sea submerges them. Through them, we travel at the mercy of life and death. The lighthouse watcher (2025) guides the visitor and enlightens the upcoming way. The landscape is marked by a boat erected on its oars (The Boat, 2025) on which a figure observes the horizon. The journey is spiritual. Mythological and historical references pervade Jean-Marie Appriou's work, inspired by art history, classical literature, science-fiction and comics. These are the roots of his creation.

The journey continues on earth, carrying the memory of landscapes and the echo of depths. The earth bears the imprint of the world. The shapes are raw, organic, mineral. This journey takes us

through elements, but also history, civilization and the cycle of life, for which the earth is the base. Man leaves its mark on earth literally and figuratively. He cultivates and domesticates it. He rises with the work of the land (*Crossing the parallel worlds*, 2018) before nature reasserts itself. Is the gaze of Man covered by lenses or coins? Is he looking at the sky, or above? Regardless of the answer, he invites us to visit another world, the one of air (*The breath of the suns*, 2018).

The face turned upward, he scrutinizes the past and the future: the moon and the stars, the Big Bang, the first second of the universe. Chinese and Western astrology combine the ephemeral and the permanent. Depending on stars position, the man defines a map guiding him through life. The shapes are the result of the human psyche. The twelve constellations are animals. The dragon appears with the hare, the cow with the scorpion, etc. They symbolize the different elements and the different worlds. An astronaut (Mitosis (cellular being), 2023) floats in the center of the clock and sends us to the moon.

Nearby, glass paste stars enable the diffusion of light and the appearance of figures, creating an illusion of presence and materializing the immaterial, the fifth essence: ether. This essence is the key to tying the elements together, as shown by the etching figures. Just like a pyramid (*The Keeper (gravity)*, 2024), a man-made mountain, is the connection between the earth and the sky, as a symbol of human spiritual elevation.

Tightly connected to the nourishing air, and a source of light, fire ends the journey; it is transformation and fusion; it seals other substances together. Like a lighthouse for the soul, it invites us for a gathering and will be activated on the night of the opening to joyously celebrate the beginning of summer. Just like fallen stars, phosphorescent glass fireflies will shine during summer nights.

Jean-Marie Appriou is a "quintessence abstractor", from Latin *quinta essentia*, the fifth essence. He invites us on this poetic journey, with about forty artworks including half produced for MO.CO.. He assembles the elements in a quest on the original matter of life, the different doors of perception for which ether is the key.
